Transfers: Transfers are free and can be used at TTC transfer points on day of issue for a one-way continuous trip. Transfer must be obtained when you pay your fare. Transfer is not valid if customer has not obtained transfer or is not valid for transfer with not transferable.

Fares - Tickets & tokens are available at subway stations, and over 1,200 authorized ticket agents in Toronto. Call Customer Information at 416-393-4636 for ticket agent locations. You need a ticket, token, pass, transfer or exact change on buses and streetcars. Drivers do not sell fares or make cash. For fares on TTC routes running beyond Toronto, call TTC Customer Information 416-393-4636.

Adult - \$2.25 cash. One ticket or token or exact cash. Adult Tokens/Tickets are 5 for \$9.00 or 10 for \$18.00.

Student - \$1.50 cash. Students 19 years of age or younger at the start of the current school year, in full-time day attendance at an eligible school in Toronto or residing in Toronto and in full-time day attendance at an eligible school outside Toronto - one ticket or exact cash with valid TTC Student Discount Card Photo Identification. Student Tickets are 5 for \$6.00 or 10 for \$12.00.

Senior Citizen - \$1.50 cash. Seniors 65 years of age or over must show appropriate proof of age when depositing fare (Driver's License Photo ID or eligible war veterans card or TTC Senior's Photo ID) or Adult fare required. One ticket or exact cash. Senior Tickets are 5 for \$6.00 or 10 for \$12.00.

Child - 50¢ cash. Children 12 years of age or under - one ticket or exact cash. Children under two years free. Child Tickets are 10 for \$4.00.

Adult, Senior & Student Metropass - Good for unlimited travel in a specific month on all regular TTC routes within Toronto, except special services. Your Metropass is valid only with the appropriate photo ID. A TTC Photo ID can be obtained from our Photo Facility located at Sherbourne subway station. Monthly portion is sold from the 24th of the previous month until the fourth working day of the month (up

until the 15th of the month at Sherbourne and Davisville stations) for which the pass will be used. Call Customer Information at 416-393-4636.

MDP (Metropass Discount Plan) - It's like getting one month free! Sign-up now for the 12-month pre-authorized payment plan and receive your Metropass by mail. Application forms available at any TTC collector's booth or telephone 416-393-4636. (*Based on a Metropass purchase for 12 consecutive months.)

Day Pass/Family Pass - Monday to Friday, or Saturdays, good for one person. Unlimited travel on any one day on all regular TTC routes after 9:30am weekdays or all day Saturdays, Sunday or Holiday, good for up to six persons, maximum two adults. Unlimited one day travel on all regular TTC routes on any one Sunday or statutory holiday.

Downtown Express Fare - An additional supplement equal to a regular fare* is required with your regular fare (for Downtown Express routes 141, 142, 143 & 144). The appropriate additional ticket or token or Downtown Express sticker may be used for the additional supplement.

Downtown Express stickers for use with the Metropass, available at King and St. Andrew stations for \$27.75** per month.

Transfers - Can be used at transfer points on day of issue for a one-way continuous trip. Transfers are free and must be obtained when you pay your fare. Ask for a transfer from a driver or get one from an automatic transfer machine in the Subway/RT station, after you pay your fare. Transfers are required between certain stations and connecting surface routes, see Subway/RT map for details.

TTC Times Two - Passengers who ride the TTC immediately before and after a GO Train or GO Bus trip can use the TTC transfer from their first ride to board the second TTC vehicle.

GTA (Greater Toronto Area) Weekly Pass - The GTA Weekly Pass is an accepted fare on all TTC, Mississauga, Brampton and York Region Transit routes, including service for persons with disabilities which are operated by these systems. Customers in possession of a GTA Weekly Pass will not be required to pay the additional zone fare when crossing municipal boundaries. The GTA Weekly Pass is transferable, with conditions, and does not require a photo identification. You may purchase a Greater Toronto Area Weekly Pass at Lawrence West, Wilson, Downsview, Finch, Islington, Warden, Kennedy, Scarborough Centre station and at ticket agents located throughout York Region for \$37.25**.

GO Twin Pass - A Twin Pass is a combined GO adult monthly pass and a TTC Metropass, available only from GO Transit. The GO monthly pass is valid for unlimited travel in one calendar month by the pass holder between two specified fare zones. Twin Pass holders can travel with a companion on the GO system on Saturdays, Sundays, and statutory holidays at no extra charge. Not transferable. Pass holders must sign the front of the GO adult monthly pass, and must produce a TTC Photo ID or valid driver's licence upon inspection. Cost: GO Transit fares are based on distance travelled. Call GO Transit or see the Fare Finder, www.gotransit.com.

Lost & Found: Located at Bay subway station, Monday - Friday, 8am - 5pm, except holidays. Call 416-393-4100, Monday - Friday, 12noon - 5pm, except holidays.

On-Street Information: InfoPosts with bus and streetcar schedules and route maps are posted at most transfer locations throughout the TTC system. They include location maps and travel tips. Routes, schedules and fares are subject to change, call 416-393-4636, 8am - 6pm daily, except holidays.

TDD - Hearing Impaired Service: 416-481-2523 - For use with TTD modern display device: route, fare and schedule information, 8am - 6pm daily, except holidays.

Multi-Language Service: 416-393-4636 - Transit information in 140 languages. Press "0", and ask the operator for your language in its English name. Call 8am - 6pm daily, except holidays.

Accessible Buses: TTC accessible buses now serve many regular TTC routes in Toronto, with more planned for the future. Look at the map (opposite side) for a current list of routes. You will recognize an accessible bus stop by the international wheelchair symbol on the post. **Not all stops along an accessible route are accessible.**

Wheel-Trans: The TTC operates a service for physically disabled persons who cannot use conventional TTC services. Call 416-393-4111, Monday - Friday, 8am - 4pm.

Community Bus: Hourly bus service for the elderly and persons with disabilities at regular TTC fares in the East York, Don Mills, Parkdale and Lawrence Manor areas. Call 416-393-4636.

PERSONAL SAFETY ON THE TTC

Designated Waiting Areas are located on all subway and Scarborough RT platforms.

The Request Stop Program allows women travelling alone on buses between 6pm and 5am to ask the driver to let them get off the bus at locations between regular TTC stops.

When leaving streetcars look to the right before stepping into the street. **Make sure all traffic has stopped.** Bus and streetcar drivers also have alarm systems in each vehicle to summon assistance, and all buses and streetcars have two-way radios. Remember to stand behind the white line when the vehicle is in motion. Move to the rear and stay clear of the doors. To tell the driver you want to get off at the next stop, pull the cord overhead, or push the button, as soon as the vehicle leaves the previous stop.

Passenger Assistance Alarms are above the windows and at the ends of all Subway & RT cars. Press this yellow strip alarm for fire, harassment, illness, accidents, passenger safety & vandalism. The train crew will arrange for assistance at the next station.

Designated Waiting Areas are located on all subway and Scarborough RT platforms.

A DWA has brighter lights as well as an intercom connected to the station collector, closed circuit TV camera, public telephone and a bench for your convenience and safety.

The **Designated Waiting Areas** are located where the guard's car stops in the subway and where the driver's car stops on the Scarborough RT.

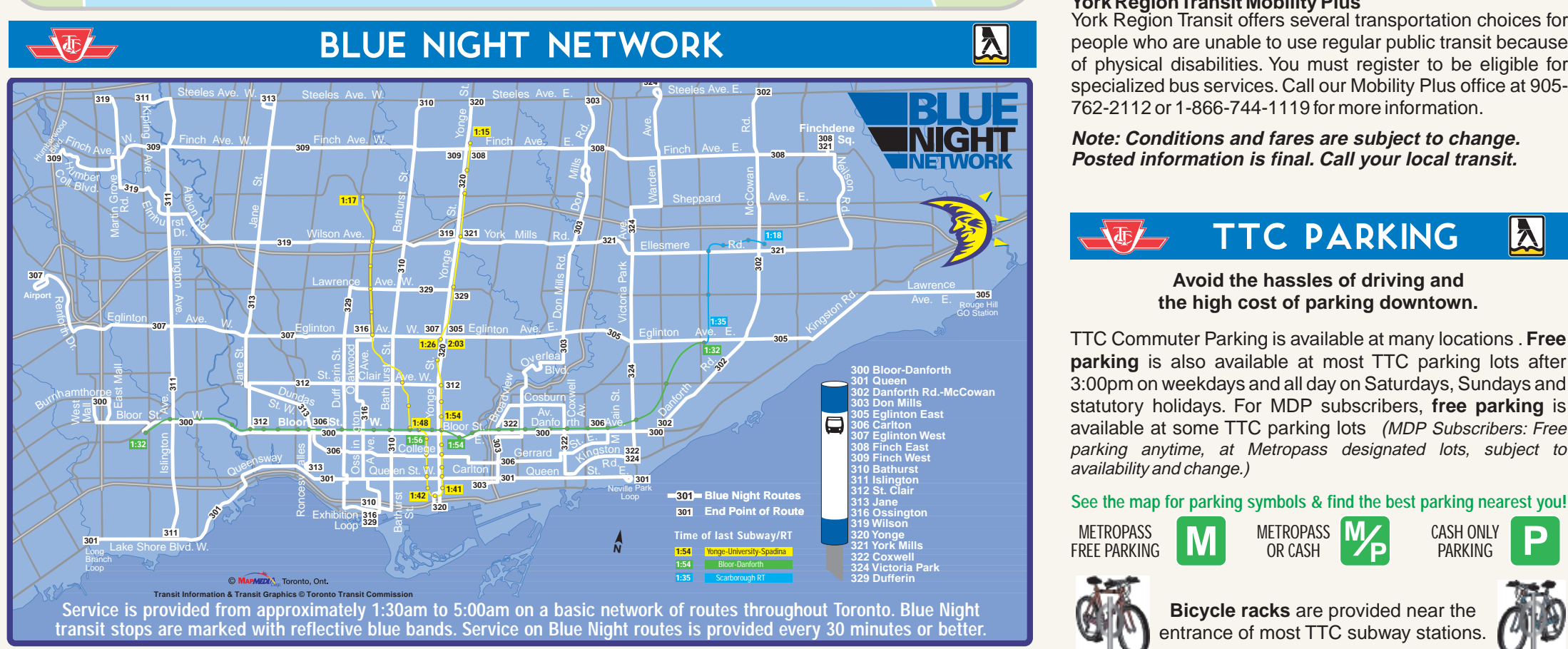
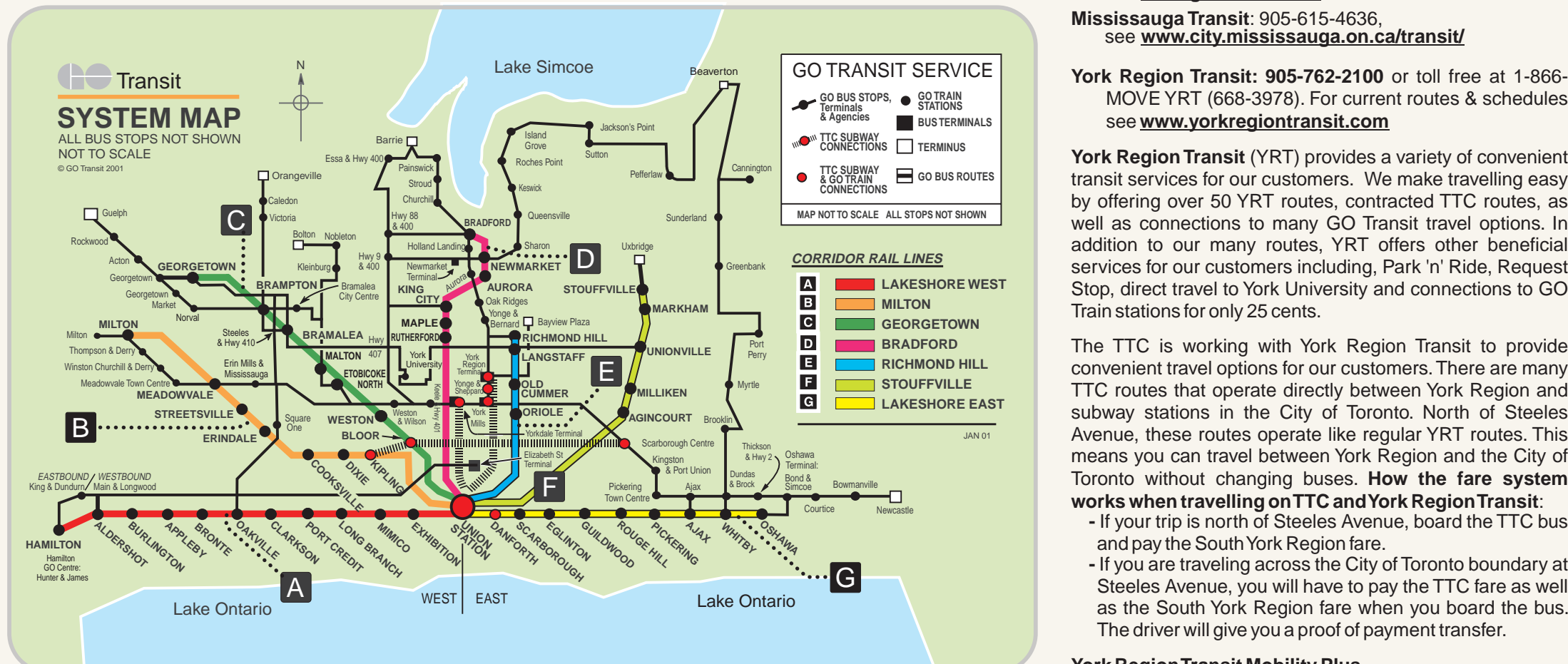
Press for Assistance
